



BETA CHAPTER ADOPTS A CLASSROOM






(1) make financial distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code for education and charitable purposes;




BLACK WOMEN'S AGENDA 2024



The election of Epsilon Zeta's Man of Iota Avery Lewis to the Senate marks a significant milestone in the political landscape of the Virgin Islands. His victory reflects the need for effective representation in the legislature and someone who genuinely cares about others. As he embarks on this new role, stakeholders will be closely watching his initiatives and contributions to the legislative process.

Soror Hendricks Elected to 6th Constitutional Convention

The 2024 Virgin Islands general election took place on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, to elect the delegate to the United States House of Representatives, all 15 seats in the Legislature of the Virgin Islands, members of the Virgin Islands Board of Elections, Board of Education, and the 15 delegates to the Sixth Constitutional Convention.

Our very own, Soror Lydia Hendricks, an elected member of the Board of Election decided to run a write-in campaign for the constitutional convention and was successful in her bid.

The convention is set to begin in January 2025 and produce a proposed Constitution by October 31, 2025. That will be the subject of a binding referendum in November 2026 and, if passed, become the fundamental law of the land as of March 31, 2027 – roughly half a century after the U.S. Congress formally authorized the Virgin Islands to create its own territory constitution.

Currently, Guam and the U.S. Virgin Islands are the only United States territories without a constitution.

Epsilon Zeta Participates in Double Good Popcorn Fundraiser for the Eastern Region

From October 20-24, the Epsilon Zeta Chapter participated in the Eastern Region's fundraising efforts to raise funds for the Anna J. Steen Scholarship Fund. It was our first time participating in the fundraiser after

Islands.

Double Good is known for its ultra premium popcorn and unique fundraising model, which allows organizations like Iota Phi Lambda Sorority to raise money while offering delicious snacks to supporters, and keeping 50% of the profits.

Double Good Popcorn's fundraising model allows organizations to sell popcorn without upfront costs. Participants set up virtual pop-up shops, promoting their sales through social media and word of mouth.

Epsilon Zeta relied heavily on Facebook and Whatsapp messaging to spread the word of our fundraiser and we were very successful.

The total sum raised by the Eastern Region was \$12,472 with 216 persons purchasing from the Anna J. Steen Turtles. Epsilon Zeta

Chapter sold a total of \$1,835 and finished as the third highest seller among the chapters that participated.

Feedback from persons who supported our fundraiser indicated high satisfaction with the quality of

the popcorn and the ease of the fundraising process. "The popcorn is always a hit with my family. My sisters and I love it and we support each time we see a Double Good fundraiser," Soror Erma Brathwaite LaMotta said from Orlando, FL.

Ruth Warren, who lives on St. Thomas ordered over \$200 in popcorn. "After Elma introduced me to Double Good popcorn, I try to always have some in stock." "I ordered and sent them to Atlanta and I will retrieve them when I travel for Christmas," she told EZ News.

While the fundraising campaign was largely successful, some EZ Sorors were reluctant to order because Double Good does not ship to the Virgin Islands.

"I ordered and shipped the popcorn to my son's college. I won't enjoy them until November when Qian returns home for Thanksgiving weekend," Soror Nadja Harrigan stated.

Soror LuAnne Roberts had her daughter in Florida order her popcorn for her and said that she will get them when she travels for her daughter's graduation in a few weeks. "I know I won't be disappointed." she said.

The partnership with Double Good Popcorn proved to be a successful fundraising initiative for the Eastern Region as scholarships continue to have a funding source as the region endeavors to assist students seeking tertiary education.




Epsilon Zeta Bids Farewell to Soror Ealsie Turnbull


Soror Turnbull became a member of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority in 1989 when she was inducted into Epsilon Zeta Chapter.

Former FIL Testifies to Raise Tobacco Buying Age to 21

On Wednesday, October 2, former FIL member, Micah Crawford and Health officials testified in support of a proposed law to raise the legal age to purchase tobacco from 18 to 21, telling the Virgin Islands' senators that it would help limit access for people most susceptible to the drug's welldocumented adverse health effects and addictive qualities.

Micah Crawford, chair of the Youth Health Equity Project appeared at the hearing and agreed that raising the age to purchase tobacco was a good idea, and stated that he warned friends about the dangers of tobacco, which can stunt physical and mental growth.



Micah Crawford, chair of the Youth Health **Equity Project, told the Senate's Committee on** Health, Hospitals, and Human Services of his support for raising the age limit to buy tobacco.

"As a youth coalition, we target tobacco use because of the significant amount that is generally used in the youth population. More youth, ranging in ages from 12-17 generally use fonta and marijuana as an escape from their reality," Crawford said. "Considering that the brain isn't fully developed until 25 years of age, using tobacco could interfere with comprehension skills, which I often see occurring."

Micah was a member of the 2024 FIL Auxiliary as a participant in EZ's FIL Cotillion. He is now a freshman at the University of the Virgin Islands, studying political science.

Senators voted to advance the tobacco bill, Bill No. 35-0289.

NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR MURDER VICTIMS COMMEMORATED

On September 25th, the Victim Services Unit of the Virgin Islands Department of Justice (DOJ), the Family Resource Center (FRC) and the Virgin Islands Police Department (VIPD) held a special ceremony to remember persons lost to homicide.

In 2007, Congress designated September 25 as the National Day of Remembrance for Murder Victims. Robert and Charlotte Hullinger, of Cincinnati, formed Parents of Murdered Children following the 1978 murder of their 19-year-old daughter, Lisa, while she was studying in Germany. The annual day of observance is on the date Lisa was murdered. The annual National Day of Remembrance for Murder Victims gives communities the opportunity to remember those lost to homicide, and honor their memories.

Soror Elma Brathwaite, Coordinator of Victim Services at the DOJ, who organized the annual event spoke to EZ News about the event. "On this day every year, the



DOJ and its partners join the families of murder victims who have tragically lost their lives to homicide to remember their loss. During the National Day of Remembrance for Murder Victims, we are reminded of the many cherished lives taken by violence."

The Remembrance Ceremony featured speeches from the VI Attorney General, Gordon Rhea, the Lieutenant Governor of the Virgin Islands, the Honorable Tregenza A. Roach, Esquire. The most emotional speaker had to have been Andrea Hamilton, who told the audience the trauma of losing her 14-year old son, Aaron to gun violence four years ago.

The evening also featured performances from Soror Merida Gumbs and Man of Iota, Eljhaie Brathwaite.




